PSRU, IPCB Strengthen Partnership to Advance Institutional Reforms



Wednesday 29th July 2026, 8 Wesley Street Freetown: The Public Sector Reform Unit (PSRU) has reaffirmed its commitment to strengthening public institutions through evidence-based reforms during engagements with the leadership and cross section of staff of the Independent Police Complaints Board (IPCB).

The main objective of the engagement was to establish the purpose of implementation matrix for the recommendations as contained in the Management and Functional Review conducted in 2025.

The Management and Functional Review sets out recommendation across IPCB's legal framework, structure, staffing, training, logistics and accommodation. This matrix consolidates all 22 recommendations into a single actionable plan.

Speaking during the engagement, PSRU Director, Mr. Sulaiman Phoray-Musa, reaffirmed the Unit's commitment to supporting public institutions in building effective governance systems through evidence-based reforms.



He disclosed that the Management and Functional Review (MFR) report for IPCB has received the concurrence of Cabinet that requires all the twenty-two recommendations to be implemented.

He highlighted the importance of sustained collaboration between the PSRU and MDAs to ensure that reform recommendations are well understood and effectively implemented.

Chief of Programmes, Mr. Albert R. E. C. Williams, underscored the need for accurate staff data and the development of a comprehensive legal framework to strengthen the IPCB's mandate.

He encouraged the Board’s leadership and staff to maintain the cooperative spirit, expressing confidence that together both institution would successfully deliver the reform objectives.

In response, IPCB Executive Secretary, Mr. Rashid Kabba, praised PSRU for its professionalism and dedication during the review process, adding that the draft MFR report is a significant milestone in the Board’s reform journey.



He reaffirmed IPCB’s commitment to implementing the recommendations, and expressed confidence that the reforms will enhance the Board’s effectiveness, independence, and public accountability.
